#### Aria Smith

When Aria, now 13, was born, every long bone in her body was broken. She has been diagnosed with Type 3 severe Osteogenesis Imperfecta, often referred to as Brittle Bone Disease. By the time she was three, she'd suffered 150 breaks. Floating in warm water is the only place she gets some relief from her daily pain. She lives outside town in a rural area surrounded by dirt and Aria couldn't go



outside in her wheelchair. FFCT provided windows and a door for the poolhouse so she can use the swim spa yearround, and put in cement

around the house so she can go outside without being carried. This has made a huge difference for Aria, who is so happy to be outdoors. In fact, she broke her femur a couple of weeks ago and within days they found her outside trying to ride her bike.

Her family tries to keep Aria's life as normal and adventurous as possible. They spend about a month out of the year in a tent, which comes with benefits and challenges—she is on her mom's back a lot, but gets to explore the great outdoors. They do primitive skills and survival camps together.
